Anteriormente, foi Professor na INSEAD, e na Solvay Business School, em Bruxelas, onde foi Vice-Presidente e Diretor do Programa de MBA, e Professor Convidado na Vlerick School of Business, Leuven, Bélgica, no KDI School of Management and Policy, Seul, Coreia do Sul e no Graduate Institute of International Economics, Genebra, Suíça.

Daniel Traça formou-se na Faculdade de Economia da Universidade Nova de Lisboa e obteve o seu Doutoramento na Columbia University, em Nova Iorque. Trabalhou como consultor do Banco Mundial e da Comissão Europeia e publicou a sua investigação científica em várias das principais revistas académicas internacionais, no domínio da Globalização e Desenvolvimento Económico.

Daniel was Visiting Professor in the KDI School of Management and Policy, in Seoul, and in the Graduate Institute of International Economics, in Geneva. Daniel graduated from Nova School of Business and Economics and obtained his PhD from Columbia University, New York. He has worked as a consultant for the World Bank and the European Commission and published his scientific research in several leading international academic journals in the field of Globalization and Economic Development.
